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## Interdisciplinary Studies Degrees – Fall 2024 Update

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The following memo provides additional information for two reports published by the Office of Institutional Effectiveness; [Interdisciplinary Studies \(IDS\) Degrees: 2015-2021](#) and [OIE Memo – Associate Degree FAQ](#).

The data in this report includes all students who have earned a degree or certificate from summer 2019 through the summer 2024 term. Over that time, almost 27,000 degrees and certificates have been awarded to students (Table 1 below). Of those, 6,734 (25%) have been Interdisciplinary Studies Degrees (IDS).

Table 2 breaks out the IDS degrees by their title/subject area. The Social Sciences IDS degree was awarded 2,122 times during the period, representing 32% of all IDS degrees awarded. The Social Behavior and Self Development IDS was awarded 1,769 times, representing 26% of all IDS degrees awarded.

## Unduplicated Counts of Degrees

Over the last few years, the College has made significant efforts to increase the number of students earning awards. These efforts include the introduction of new certificates and degrees, and intentional outreach to students who apply for graduation. As noted in [OIE Memo – Associate Degree FAQ](#), about 35% of students during the time period earned more than one degree.

Therefore, while 6,734 IDS degrees were awarded between 2019-2024, there were actually 4,118 individual students who earned an IDS degree (Table 3).

Table 4 contains the unduplicated count of students earning degrees broken out by the combination of degrees they earned. During the time period, 1,743 students only earned an IDS degree, representing about 42% of all IDS earners and about 17% of all degree earners.

Table 5 below disaggregates the students who earned a degree by race/ethnicity. To simplify the table, the combination of degrees has been modified, with the third column representing students who earned a local AA or an ADT but not an IDS, and the fourth column representing students who earned an IDS and an AA and/or an ADT. Of note, Black/African American students made up about 6% of all IDS only earners compared to about 2% of AA and/or ADT earners.

## Transfers To Four Year Universities

To help identify any patterns regarding transfer to four-year universities, student records were matched with four-year university data from the National Student Clearinghouse (NSCH). NSCH data comes with a few caveats; the data are uploaded by four-year institutions on an irregular basis, students are able to opt-out from having their data reported in the NSCH, and students without a social security number are more likely to be mismatched or unidentified in the data set.

Due to the delays in uploading data by four-year universities, data in the following tables exclude students who earned an award between summer 2023 and summer 2024. In addition, any student who was found to have any four-year university enrollment prior to earning their award are also excluded.

It should also be noted that the percentages in the tables below do not represent a “transfer rate”, as they only include students who successfully completed a program of study.

About 71% of students who only earned an ADT degree during the period had four-year enrollment records compared to 56% of students who only earned an IDS degree. When all IDS categories are combined, about 62% of students who earned an IDS degree had a four-year enrollment record.

Most racial subgroups had higher percentages of four-year university enrollments when they earned a combination IDS and AA/ADT (Table 7 below). In particular, Latina/o/x students who earned an IDS and an AA/ADT had a 4-year enrollment rate that was 14 percentage points higher than those who only earned an IDS.
